



Events Made Easy Curriculum

GSSI uses a variety of curriculum to showcase the Girl Scout National Program Portfolio! Below are the descriptions of our most recent program offerings. Glitzy Glam curriculum is based on the Breath It's You Planet Love It Journey and is appropriate for all age levels. Relaxation is very important to our bodies and our minds! This program will allow girls to get in touch with their creative side and learn new ways and techniques to take care of themselves. This is a great program for a troop overnight or just a day of pampering! Did you know that you can make your own natural beauty products with items from your own home? The activities are great for SU events or troops overnights! This program is all about taking care of your mind, body, and spirit and teaching the girls the importance of realization so their bodies will have more energy.

Brave curriculum is based on the Junior national program journey Agent of Change - It's Your World: Change It! and Disney's Brave movie. Program is appropriate for grades K – 5. Girls will travel to the enchanting Scottish Highlands, where they will harness all their skills and resources to discover the meaning of true bravery. Participants will join a new clan to compete in the Highland games, make their own crown and crest, and watch Disney's Brave movie. Program is four (4) hours in length.

My Promise, My Faith curriculum allows all girls to further strengthen the connection between their faith and Girl Scouts. Through this program girls will carefully examine the Girl Scout Law and directly tie it to tenets of her faith. By completing this program, girls will meet the requirements to earn their My Promise, My Faith pin. Curriculum includes five (5) sessions, ninety (90) minutes per session.

Global Action – Together We Can curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool for K – 5 grade girls. As you may know, two girl members represented GSSI at the **Girls' World Forum** summer 2012, in Chicago, the third and final event in a series of forums that were part of the WAGGG's global centenary celebrations. The World Forums, where girls worldwide said "Together We Can Change Our World," addressed the United Nations' Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The Global Action: Together We Can! curriculum is designed to give younger girls the opportunity to have a voice and earn an award in the process, as well as to honor our GSSI teens' participation and help continue the spirit of global change.

Princess for the Day: Be an Agent of Change curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool for K – 5th grade girls. It is based on the national Girl Scout Journey program Agent of Change: It's Your World – Change It and welcomes girls to an enchanting Girl Scout Princess Party, where they will enjoy a royal celebration, with movies, games and tiaras! Hooray! Every girl dreams about becoming a princess and being glamorous like a fairy tale heroine. But what really makes a heroine?

Jump Event curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool for K– 5 grade girls and will focus on activities from the three (3) Brownie, Junior, and Cadette Journeys, It's Your World, It's Your Planet, and It's Your Story. Girls will have a chance to try out activities that they will do when they “jump” to the next level of Girl Scouting! (Example: Daisy Girl Scouts will try out activities from the Brownie Journeys) This glimpse will allow girls and leaders the opportunity to get excited about their future in Girl Scouts. Note: Girls do not need to be bridging to enjoy this program – it's great for all girls to have a chance to see what awaits them in the future of Girl Scouting.

A World of Girls curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool for K – 5 grade girls. It is based on the Brownie journey book by the same name with activities at the different stations drawn from ideas in the book. A World of Girls is designed to launch the journey book series with your group and should prompt insights on how to coordinate journeys with the Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting. Journeys and the Girl's Guide are at the core of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience national portfolio that offers a powerful leadership development opportunity for girls. As girls experience A World of Girls, they will learn about themselves, others, and the world around them. In a culminating event each will create her own book to add to her Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting as a remembrance of the fun she had on this journey. You'll take away some great memories, too!

Birthday Party Launch curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool and is appropriate for any grade level of girls. It focuses on celebrating the Girl Scout's 100th Anniversary Birthday but can be used to showcase our rich tradition. Today's girls are part of a historic time in Girl Scouting as journeys, combined with The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting, provide girls with even more wonderful opportunities...and there's no better way to launch than with a party! Of course every birthday party must have a theme! Mission: Possible is the one that might work best for this Birthday Party. Participants will rediscover Girl Scout customs and traditions from the past 100 years, and connect together to ensure that the Girl Scout mission lasts another 100 years. Girls should come dressed as their favorite spy and be ready for a day full of mystery, history, and adventure.

Pound Puppy & Kitty: The Power of Advocacy curriculum should be used as a recruitment and/or retention tool for girl's grades 6 – 12. It is based on the national Girl Scout Journey program Your Voice, Your World: The Power of Advocacy and promotes animal advocacy, which means to actively support a cause or position on animals. This program will help older girls gain additional leadership skills and courage as well as enable them to use their voice to speak out on issues they are passionate about. In return, animals in need will receive handmade items, an enormous amount of attention and care from the girls, and possible food and supply donations! This curriculum is in two (2) parts: program and service to the community.
