Join us for the Spring Troop Camporee at Camp Koch!



We invite all troops to kick off the summer camp season at the **Spring Troop Camporee on May 7** and enjoy Camp Koch while spring is in full bloom. This session is a perfect opportunity for troops who want to visit camp but don't know where to start. GSSI will organize everything for you; all you do is show up with your girls and have fun! Troops can attend for the day or spend the night and put their camping skills to the test.

At the Camporee, girls will learn about Leave No Trace principles, participate in team-building adventures, and try our expanded variety of shooting sports! All girls will be able to use our exciting new slingshots, Brownies will have fun with BB guns and archery, and Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors will have an opportunity to try their hand at knife and hatchet throwing.

To make the day more accessible to all, we will only be using upper camp (the ballfield, Breezy Corner, Pinewood, and Hilltop); troops will not have to tackle the hills and long treks back and forth from both sides of the property.

We will also hold Basic Outdoor Skills and Troop Camp Training sessions for adults. (Note: these adults will not be counted in troop safety ratios.)

Cost:

- Day Option: (Saturday, 9:00 AM-4:00 PM CST) \$15 per person; includes lunch and snack.
- Overnight Option: (Saturday 9:00 AM-Sunday 9:00 AM CST) \$25 per person; includes lunch, snack, and dinner on Saturday plus breakfast on Sunday. Platform tent and pop-up tent accommodations only; troops must bring their own tents if not sleeping in platform tents. Platforms will be available first-come first serve during the registration period. (Please note, leaders must have completed Basic Outdoor Skills and Troop Camp Training prior to the Camporee to stay overnight.)

Thanks to a generous grant from Alcoa Foundation, GSSI will again offer mini grants for take action and highest award projects that focus on environmental

sustainability and/or environmental education throughout the remainder of the 2021-2022 membership year.

Troops, service unit events, service unit camps, and individuals (registered members grades K-12) must submit a mini grant proposal form for consideration. If awarded, the project will receive \$75.00 towards project expenses.

Project plans and proposed budgets must be submitted to and approved by GSSI before starting. Final project reports and receipts must be submitted by troop/group/individual to GSSI at the completion of the service for tracking.

Projects must be completed and submitted before September 1, 2022.
