Appointment and Support

Occasional Helping Hands are appointed by Troop Co-Leaders or Girl Scouts of Southwest Indiana (GSSI) staff. To qualify, an adult (male or female) must register as a member, complete a background check, and agree to fulfill a one-year renewable term. Co-Leaders will assign tasks based on troop needs and the volunteers' interests, abilities, and availability. Additional support is provided by GSSI staff and experienced volunteers.
