Appointment and Support

Troop Co-Leaders are appointed by Girl Scouts of Southwest Indiana (GSSI) staff and asked to fulfill a one-year renewable term. To qualify, an adult (male or female) must register as a member, pass a background check, and complete onboarding with GSSI staff. Co-Leaders are not required to have previous Girl Scout experience. When forming a new troop, Co-Leaders work directly with staff to secure a second Co-Leader, book a public meeting location, welcome new troop members, build a strong volunteer team of parents/guardians, and establish a troop checking account. Continued yearlong support is provided by staff and experienced volunteers.
