

Honor Troop / Golden Honor Troop Tracking Sheet

This form is used for troops that achieve the Essential Elements of a Girl Scout Troop and provide overall excellence in troop management and programming in a given year. To achieve this honor, leaders and girls must work in partnership with each other, other troops, Service Team and council staff.

This award is for activities completed October 1 – September 30 of the membership year. This form is used to track progress throughout the year; the final application can be submitted online by October 1 of the membership year.

Essential Elements of a Troop

Requirements must be met for the program year in which the application is being submitted.

	Honor Troop - Family Welcomed (at least 4) As a troop leader:				
	Hold a parent meeting in the fall.				
	Communicate regularly with families - families are invited to activities, troop newsletter or emails, etc.				
	Encourage families to read the council eNewsletter and visit the GSUSA and GSSI websites frequently.				
	Encourage troop adults to register as volunteers (at least 50% of girls have a registered approved GS parent).				
	With girls, plan and hold a troop year-end celebration for girls and their families.

	Achieve all 5 options under the Family Welcomed section.				

	or Troop – Belonging to a Sisterhood (at least 4) a troop:
	Promote all pathways (events, camps, travel) by encouraging participation in national and council activities.
	Attend a service unit or council event.
	Plan and carry out an activity with another group in the council (any age level).
	Encourage families to participate in unique giving opportunities promoted throughout the year.
	Make a contribution to Girl Scouts of Southwest Indiana (troops may designate to a specific initiative or give to the general fund).

	Achieve all 5 options under the Belonging to a Sisterhood section.
	or Troop – Leadership Development (all required) a Troop:
	Explore additional awards available for the troop's level (Safety, Religious, Global Action, Bridging, and Leade Awards for girls 6-12 grade).
	Participate in activities that focus on the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE).
	Girls participate in the decision-making process at an age-appropriate level.
	After activities, girls reflect on what they have learned and what they would change if repeating the activity.

	Explore the requirements for Girl Scouts' Highest Awards (Bronze, Silver, and Gold).
	Girls have opportunities to work in small groups and take ownership of a project or part of a project.
	Girls learn a new skill from each other.
	or Troop – Community Engagement (all required) a Troop:
	Explore opportunities for girls to change the community.
	Complete a community service project or Journey Take Action Project.

	Complete 1 additional community service project or a National Service Project with GSUSA.
	or Troop – Skill Building (all required) Troop:
	Use our online Badge Explorer.
	Explore the four GSUSA pillars: STEM, Entrepreneurship, Outdoors, and Life Skills.
	Complete one Journey or 4 skill building badges.

Golden Honor Troop Add-On
Contact a community partner listed in GSSI's Program Guide.
Honor Troop – Expanding World View (at least 3) As a Troop:
Participate in a World Thinking Day activity.
Meet an expert related to a Journey or badge theme.
Plan and carry out a field trip during the year.
Plan and carry out at least one activity that deals with current social issues such as racial justice, bullying, body self-image, etc.
Golden Honor Troop Add-On (all required)
Fulfill all requirements under the Expanding World View section.
Explore travel opportunities for your troop.
Honor Troop – Ceremony and Tradition (at least 4) As a Troop:
Plan and carry out an Investiture/Rededication Ceremony.
Plan and carry out an outdoor activity like a hike, cookout, game, campout, etc.
Incorporate the Girl Scout sign, handshake, friendship circle or greeting into group gatherings.
Celebrate the Girl Scout birthday together.
Plan and carry out an Awards/Bridging Ceremony.
Golden Honor Troop Add-On (all required)
Girls develop their own new group tradition and carry it out during gatherings.
Girls study the history of Girl Scouts and its founder, Juliette Gordon Low.
Honor Troop – Adult Support (all required) As a Troop Leader:
Ensure that all co-leaders have completed their onboarding training.
Verify that all adult troop volunteers regularly receive and read the council newsletter and visit the website.
Connect with other adult volunteers in the area by attending at least 2 Service Unit Meetings or volunteering at or more Service Unit Events.
Golden Honor Troop Add-On (at least 2)
Represent at one or more council-wide meetings such as the Annual Meeting or Volunteer Leadership Summits
Explore the online Volunteer Toolkit.
Participate in additional GGSI adult learning opportunities this program year (On-the-Go, Fire Building, etc.)

	Work towards the Girl Scout Cookie Program's 5 Skills for Girls.
	A trained Troop Cookie Volunteer coordinates all aspects of the troop's cookie business logistics.

	Plan and carry out at least 1 summer activity.
	Plan and carry out an activity to encourage non-Girl Scouts to join Girl Scouting.
	Explore GSUSA's What Age Levels Do and Badge Chart.
	Set a goal for a future trip/adventure and begin planning/fundraising for it.

	Fulfill at least 5 of the above requirements in Experiencing Progression.
