Council Cookie Lotteries

Any remaining booth time slots from Council Lotteries are now available as first come, first serve (FCFS) in Smart Cookies. Troops can select 2 FCFS slots.

Troop Secured Booths

Don't forget to register your troop secured booths in Smart Cookies. Adding them to the Smart Cookies platform allows you to accept credit cards at the booth and will add your booth to the Cookie Finder website and app.

Notes for adding multiple booths at the same location to Smart Cookies:

- If you have multiple booths at the same location, you only need to list the location once in Troop Secured Booths. You may then add multiple appointment times and dates for that location.
- To add an additional booth to a location at a later date:
 - Navigate to the My Reservations page

- Scroll to the booth you need to add to, click on the three dots and select "Booth Details" from the dropdown menu. This will take you to the page for this booth location.
- Add additional booths using the "Appointment Times" tab.

Gluten Free Cookies

If your troop needs Gluten Free (GF) Cookies, please contact your cupboard manager by Thursday, February 3, if you have not already done so. (This is for troops who did not pre-order the GF cookie or troops who did pre-order but need additional cookies.) Each cupboard manager has a list of these orders, and we shouldn't have a problem fulfilling the orders that have already been placed. Cupboards will fulfill troop cookie orders first. Any additional GF cookies will then be available for troop cookie booths.

Troops that pre-ordered GF cookies will receive them with their initial order. Any additional GF cookies needed will be picked up at your local cupboard.

Additional Updates

- **Delivery dates & times:** Be sure to confirm your cookie delivery date, location, and time with your SUCC!
- **Cookie costumes** can be checked out for cookie booths. There will be a limit of 2 costumes checked out at a time for a troop. The return date will be confirmed when the troop checks them out. Costumes will be sanitized between uses.




